<sup>\*</sup> Treaty 13, also known as the Toronto Purchase, was an agreement made in 1805 between the British Crown and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. In this treaty, the Mississaugas ceded a large area of land around what is now Toronto, Ontario, in exchange for various forms of compensation, including goods and a yearly annuity. The terms of the treaty have been a source of ongoing discussion and negotiation, as many Indigenous people argue that the terms were not fully understood or properly honored at the time. 






















### **Farewell Encore Event**


